4-Patch Blocks, 2 at a Time

Drop Spindle Spinning

with

For centuries, people have spun wool and other fibers into yarn on simple hand spindles. Working with washed and processed wool fibers in this class, we will spin with the modern version of prehistoric hand spindles. You will learn the spindle twirling, how to draw out fibers and add twist and finally to take two twisted strands and spin them into useable yarn.

For her cost of \$12, you will receive a spindle, wool fibers and a list of resources.



Ukrainian Egg Decorating

Pysanky ("pih-sahn-KIH") or Ukrainian egg decorating is done using the batik method, where patterns are drawn on the egg in molten wax. The egg is dipped in dye to color the parts not covered with wax. In the end, the wax is melted off the eggshell, leaving an elaborate design. You will also make a box for your eggs.

For her cost of \$15, you will leave with 2-3 decorated eggs, materials to complete the eggs at home (polyurethane, glue, hanger and string), an informational handout on Pysanky and information on where to order supplies.



Flying Geese Table Runner

In this workshop, Linda will lead the group through the steps to make a variation on a flying geese table runner. The center forms a focal point from which the "geese" fly. The runner measures 14-1/2" X 38".

4-Patch Blocks, 2 at a Time

The 4-patch block is used in many quilt designs, often in large numbers. In this workshop, we will make them **two at a time** to help shorten the process. We will use the blocks to border a quilt you have in the works or a fabric panel or a fabric you would like to feature. If you prefer, you can make a quilt with 4-patch blocks and alternate blocks. The technique is the same.
